


## Principal's news with Mr Brendan Maher

This Tuesday we commence the annual NAPLAN testing for all students in Years 3,57 and 9 . This is a way schools can
 measure the effectiveness of programs and the overall delivery of literacy and numeracy. More importantly, the data gathered, provides schools with the opportunity to fine-tune the curriculum and the ways we can support each student. The tests will run during the morning sessions on all three days, with normal classes running after the NAPLAN exams are completed.

Last Thursday we held our Mother's Day Picnic and it was great to see so many mums, grandmothers and aunties attend the picnic and the afternoon performance. I hope all of our mums were spoilt on Sunday and had a great day with their families. Thankyou to Shaun Rowlands for organising the event and to the staff for preparing the kids for their performances.

In cooperation with Pandora Gallery, Coolah Central School will be involved in a combined school Art Exhibition commencing on the $20^{\text {th }}$ of May. There is an opening for the exhibition on the evening of the $29^{\text {th }}$ of May. All students are able to submit their best art works and have them displayed for the entire community to see. This is a great initiative and I encourage everyone to take the time to go and see the great work from the kids of Coolah.

Once again Coolah Central School children are shining in the performing arts with three students representing the school at this years Canberra International Music Festival with Moorambilla Voices. Sophie Cook, Jade Gardiner and Phoebe Ellis have been performing since last Thursday and will complete their performances this Monday. This is a great achievement for the girls and also the largest number of students from one school participating with Moorambilla at the event. Well done girls on a great achievement.
