# IMPORTANT NOTICE COOLAH CENTRAL SCHOOL P & C ASSOCITAION

The Coolah Parents and Citizens Association Annual General Meeting was held on the 21<sup>st</sup> February 2017. Attendance was very disappointing, with only two of the four executive positions being filled.

The P & C committee cannot operate without the fulfilment of these positions.

As a result of this **a special meeting of the P & C is going to be held on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> April 2017 at 6pm in the school staffroom.** The positions of Vice President and Secretary must be filled at this meeting. If the positions are still not filled at the completion of this

meeting, the committee will not be able to operate and the P & C will cease.

This will mean that all the funds and equipment currently held by the P & C for the benefit of all the students will be returned to the P & C Federation. This amount is in excess of \$20,000. This also means that the following items/activities will not be subsidised and you will either have to pay full price for the items/activities or they will simply not exist:

# On and off the bus safely

Your child is most at risk in the minutes after getting off the bus. You can reduce this risk. Meet your child (or arrange for another trusted adult to meet your child) at the bus stop, never on the opposite side of the road.

Wait until the bus has been driven away before choosing the safest place to cross the road, then follow the usual road crossing procedures with your children.

STOP! One step back from the kerb.

LOOK! For traffic to your right, left and right again.

LISTEN! For the sounds of approaching traffic.

THINK! Whether it is safe to cross.

Teach your children to keep turning their head in both directions to look and listen for traffic as they cross the road

While waiting at the bus stop, stand well away from

the passing traffic. Never wait right at the kerb. Remind your children that when a bus is fitted with seatbelts, they must buckle up. Until they turn ten, hold hands with your child as you cross the road.

You make the most of any feedback you are given to make adjustments to your approach to your work to improve your outcomes.

Homework will be contract 7 and is due on Friday.



Students can bring the reading record sheet to the library lesson and we can log the books at school. Or students can log the books at home using the Premer's Reading Challenge website.


