### EXAM RULES

1. Students should be on time for all exams. Late arrivals will be permitted entry at the discretion of the presiding teacher.
2. No student will be allowed to leave the Examination Room except in an emergency.
3. Students may not speak to any person other than to a teacher whilst and Examination is in progress; nor may they behave in any way likely to disturb the work of any student or otherwise upset the discipline of the examination.
4. Students must equip themselves properly for each examination. Borrowing of items should not be necessary and will not be allowed.
5. Students are not permitted to have with them at their desks any books, notes, papers or material other than the aids necessary for the particular examination.
6. Calculators may be used in the subjects of Mathematics, Geography, & Science **ONLY** and must be board approved.
7. No mobile phones or electronic devices are permitted in the examination room.

# GATSIANS BIG DAY

Following the success of the Gifted and Talented programs run over 2016 and 2017, a group of students from Years 4 to 10 was again selected by their teachers to undertake this year's challenge program. The program is made up of two Challenges. Each week the Students are presented with a Challenge Sheet which has a number of components. Literacy and Vocabulary are the first component with students required to seek the meaning of a less used word and then put them into context. This is followed by a logic or mathematical problem; always fun. The third component is a research item with students given a photograph of something famous, or not so famous, and then having to identify what and where it is. The last component is a creative one where the students had to make something out of a presented shape or pattern. A bit Mr Squiggle this task.

The Second Challenge is termed questions of Choice, with the students undertaking a research task into a topic entirely of their own choice, and following a set of questions set by them. This culminated in them presenting their findings (or answers) to a gathering of fellow Gatsians, Parents and family members and staff. This presentation day, held last week was very successful with the kids presenting on a wide range of topics from V8 engines to Cleopatra, from Architecture to a Musical performance, from the Renaissance to Communism and Ocean Blooms. The work of the students was at a very good standard and well received by the audience. It is planned that a similar program will run in 2019, perhaps with some refinement.
