Principal's Address End of Term Assembly Term 1, 2018

Good morning Parents, Guests, students and staff.

It's my pleasure to give the Principal's Address for Term 1 on a day that we celebrate the achievements of our students so far this year. Term 1 has been extremely busy. We have had many excursions that allow students to complement the learning they gain at school with experiences in the wider community.

Students represented the school at the Commonwealth Games Baton Relay in Coonabarabran. They participated in the Junior Judging at the Binnaway show, with some students judging at the Sydney Royal Easter Show. Students visited our sister school in Sydney and we look forward to a reciprocal visit from them later in the year. Primary students participated in an excursion to participate in debating workshops and the Year 11 Industrial Technology Metal went to Dubbo to complete an industry study.

The ASPIRE Team from the University of NSW visited the school meeting with all year groups. As part of this program selected Year 9 students visited the University in Sydney and a group of Year 10 students visited the Australian Defence Force Academy in Canberra. Secondary students participated in the Learning to Lead Program with Dunedoo Central School and other senior students participated in work placement programs as part of their VET studies.

Presentations and workshops at Coolah Central School have included;

Federation and Beyond, Moorambilla, visits from NRL players, the Police Youth Liaison Officer and study skills workshops. Students continue to access extra-curricula opportunities in music. The vocal group continues to rehearse twice a week and a new music program for primary students," Rockskool", has started this term.

Our students continue to excel in sport. Our swimming carnival was at the start of the term and many students have represented the school at the zone, regional and state carnivals. Other students have participated in basketball, touch football, netball, cricket, rugby league, soccer and rugby union.

The infrastructure and physical environment at Coolah Central School continues to improve leading to enhanced learning opportunities for all students. The Trade Training Centre began operating at the start of this Term and parents and community are invited to attend the official opening of this fantastic facility early next term. The library refurbishment was completed and it has been great to see many staff and students utilising this facility both in class time and at lunchtimes.

The old woodwork room has been refurbished and converted into a dedicated music room enabling music education to be delivered to all students in a suitable space. The exterior of the school is in the process of being fully painted and this should be complete early next term.

The secondary Computer Room refurbishment is almost complete and this includes new data cabling which will increase operating speeds and new furniture creating a better layout for teaching and learning. This means that Coolah Central School will have 4 dedicated spaces for computer and technology based learning enabling us to cater for the learning needs of our students now and into the future.

The school Parents and Citizens Association continues to meet and participate in many community events raising funds to support learning opportunities for all students at the school. I will like to thank this dedicated team who have done so much for the school. This group meets in the school staff common room at 6.30pm on the 3rd Tuesday of each month and new members are always welcome. Meeting dates are included in the school newsletter also.

Lastly a school is only as good as its staff. We are privileged at Coolah Central School to have such a committed, dedicated and skilful teaching and support staff who support the learning of all students. They go above and beyond and do amazing work. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all staff for the work they do.

Students; Thank you for working so hard this term learning all that you can, helping your classmates learn all that they can and in supporting your teachers in providing interesting and stimulating learning opportunities and experiences. Have a safe and restful holiday and we look forward to seeing you back at school on Tuesday May 1st.
