Welcome back to Term 2. A big thankyou to all the students, and parents, who assisted in participating in the ANZAC Day Commemorations in town during the school holidays. It was great to see so many people there both at the Dawn Service and at the Main Service.

It was also great to celebrate the achievements of students in Term 1 at the End of Term Assembly on the last Friday before the holidays. Many students were recognised for their achievements at this event. I have included my address from this assembly at the end of this report as it gives a general outline of the achievements in Term 1.

I have received fantastic reports from the students, staff and parents who participated in the All Roads to The Royal Excursion to the Royal Easter Show in Sydney over the holidays. This was a fantastic opportunity for our students and a huge thankyou to those teachers, Mrs Thompson, Mrs Staniforth and Mrs Meyers, who took time from their holidays to enable our students to participate, and to Mrs Thompson who co-ordinated the excursion.

On Monday all teaching staff took part in professional learning as part of the Student Free Day. They participated in training in the External Validation Process and the use of Evidence to Inform Practice. This is in preparation for the External Validation process which Coolah Central School will undergo later this term.

A reminder that the canteen is no longer offering credit. Students who purchase food at the canteen must pay at the time. Any student who has credit owing to the canteen will not be served until the outstanding money owed is paid. The school will assist any student who has no food at school and students will need to see the Principal or Deputy Principal for assistance if required. Vocal group practice continues from next week on Monday lunchtimes for all interested students. As always I can be contacted at the school should you have any concerns.

Principal's Address. Term 1 Assembly 2019.

Good morning Parents, Guests, students and staff.

It's my pleasure to give the Principal's Address for Term 1 on a day that we celebrate the achievements of our students so far this year. Term 1 has been extremely busy.

We have had many excursions that allow students to complement the learning they gain at school with experiences in the wider community.

Students participated in the Junior Judging at the Binnaway show, and 33 students will be attending the Sydney Royal Easter Show with 3 staff over 4 days of the school holidays.

Senior students, many of whom are currently on work placement, have participated in Careers Days at Dubbo and Mudgee, a Rotary Youth Driver

Awareness Day and ASPIRE workshops in Dubbo. Year 7 students had an excursion to Wellington Caves.

All of our new kindergarten students have settled in well and the Best-start kindergarten program is allowing the school to work closely with parents to support the early learning of these students. The Got It! Team from NSW Health is working with the school and parents over Terms 1 to 3 to support the social and emotional development of our students in Kindergarten to Year 2 and all students are benefitting from the staff Professional Learning the Got It Team provided with the Second Step Program.

Presentations and workshops at Coolah Central School have included;

Living History, Moorambilla, Sharing Culture Presentation, visits from NRL players and the ASPIRE Team from the University of NSW.

Our students continue to excel in sport. Our swimming carnival was at the start of the term and many students have represented the school at the zone, regional and state carnivals. Other students have participated in basketball, touch football, netball, cricket, rugby league, soccer and rugby union.

The infrastructure and physical environment at Coolah Central School continues to improve leading to enhanced learning opportunities for all students.

The Primary Computer Room is currently being refurbished and this includes 30 new computers and new furniture creating a better layout for teaching and learning. Thirty new laptops have been purchased to replace the aging ones in use in the library and a computer workstation with 6 computers has been established for Stage 3 students to use. Next term an audio and video recording studio is being established using 6 IMac computers allowing students to record, edit and produce their own music and videos. This means that Coolah Central School will have 5 dedicated spaces for computer and technology based learning enabling us to cater for the learning needs of our students now and into the future.

Over the holidays new seating is being installed in both Primary and Secondary areas allowing us to establish outside classrooms for the delivery of lessons and also better cater for students at break times. It is hoped that we can focus on improvements in the Infants Playground in the second half of this year.

The school Parents and Citizens Association continues to meet and participate in many community events raising funds to support learning opportunities for all students at the school. I would like to thank this dedicated team who have done so much for the school. This group meets in the school staff common room on the 3rd Tuesday of each month and new members are always welcome. Meeting dates are included in the school newsletter.

STUDY SKILLS TIP FOR MAY: BARRIERS TO DEVELOPING A GOOD MEMORY

Many students say 'I don't have a good memory' but there are many barriers to developing a good memory that are able to be overcome. Here are the top 3:

1. NEGATIVE MINDSET ATTITUDE

Henry Ford once famously said, "whether you believe you can, or you can't, you are right". This refers to your mindset or mental attitude, and the concept that your mind is powerful enough to enable your thoughts to create your reality. If you have a negative attitude to your memory, it will likely reduce your chance of developing and maintaining a good memory. There are some simple steps you can take to start making changes to negative thoughts. Be aware that negative thoughts are just a habit, and habits can be changed with a little effort. Awareness is the key to changing a habit, as you need to consciously be aware of the current habit before you can change it – so start catching yourself in the act of making negative statements. Affirm your intention to improve the way you think. Then correct the negative statement you just made, and make it into a more positive one.

2. ABSENTMINDEDNESS/NOT PAYING ATTENTION

The first stage of the memory process is encoding the information that is to be remembered – thus the brain uses the senses and emotions to process the information and form a memory. Here are some ways in which you can be less absentminded:

- Setting an intention to become more attentive.
- Sitting up front where there are less things to distract you, especially if you have difficulty paying attention in class.
- Taking notes in class to ensure you listen.

3. STRESS/ANXIETY

Stress will increase the likelihood of being distracted, resulting in low concentration meaning that information may not be encoded accurately – and thus cannot be later retrieved. Stress may also result in mental blanks. For example, if you're stressed before an exam, you may not be able to think clearly and access and retrieve the information you need. The best thing to do is to take ten deep breaths and calm down to allow your mind to focus.

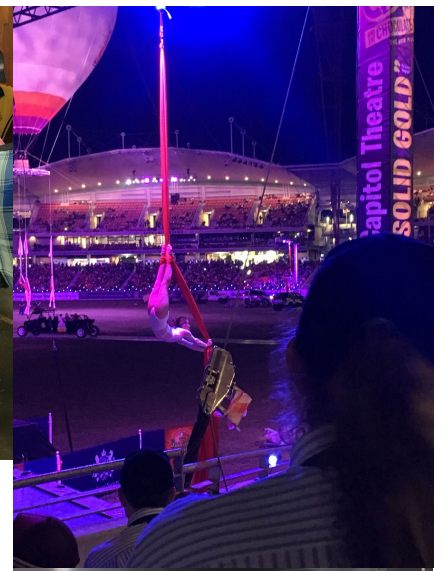

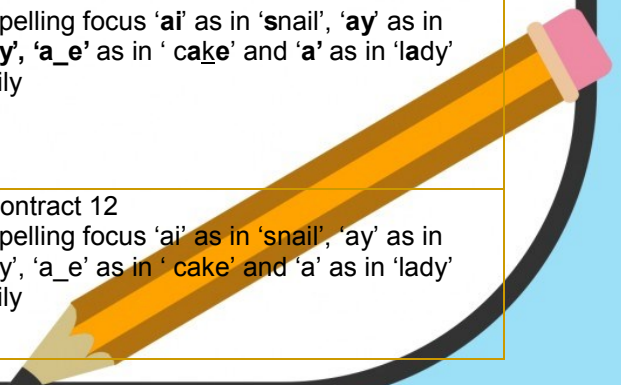
