working with you too, the parents and carers, who play a vital role in the education of their students. If we work together we can achieve great things. I am very approachable and hope that you will feel comfortable in

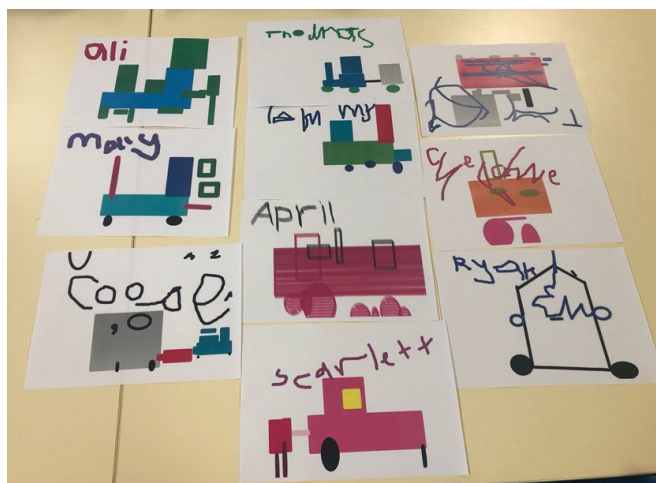
contacting me with any issues or concerns. I like to hear the good stuff too.

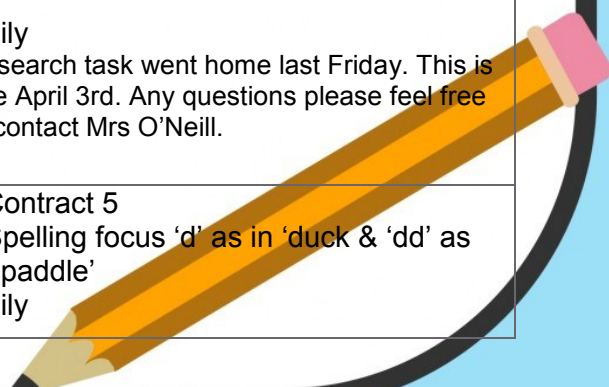

**Collaborative. Respectful. Communication.**

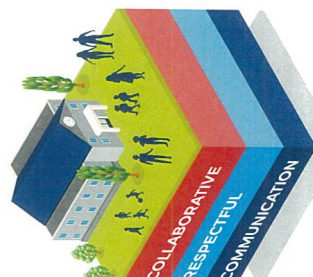
