Welcome to Week 8A. Last week saw the completion of the External Validation process at the school. This process is completed by each school across the state every 5 years. On Thursday two Principals came to the school to review the evidence we had collated and discuss where we had indicated that we fit when mapped against the domains of the School Excellence Framework. For each of the 14 domains it was established that the school had rated themselves accurately. A special thankyou to all staff in the school who were part of the preparation for this activity especially Linda Milford who coordinated the process as External Validation Head Teacher, Phil Jones who backfilled as Head Teacher Teaching and Learning and Martine Burgess, Alison Meares, Lauren O'Neill, Rikki Esdaile, Lisa McDonald and Phil Jones who all led strategic Direction Teams as part of this process.

We continue to upgrade facilities at the school ensuring that students have access to the best possible learning equipment and opportunities. Recently the Primary Computer Room refurbishment was finished. This has included new computers and furniture. We have upgraded the laptops in the library and are in the process of creating a Video and Audio Production Centre using IMac computers as part of the refurbished music room. This means that Coolah Central School will have 5 dedicated rooms for the teaching of digital technology.

New outdoor furniture has been installed for students in the playground, improvements continue to be made to the hall and we are in the process of establishing a sensory room for students with additional needs.

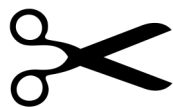

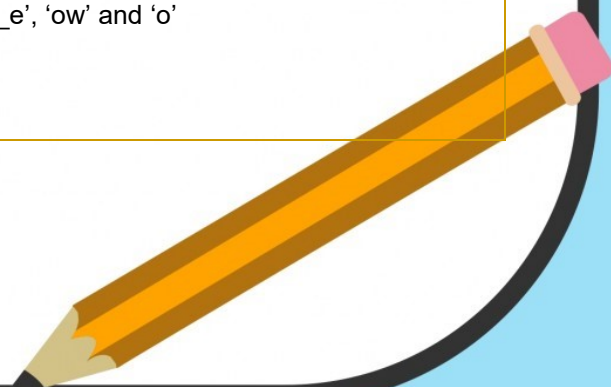

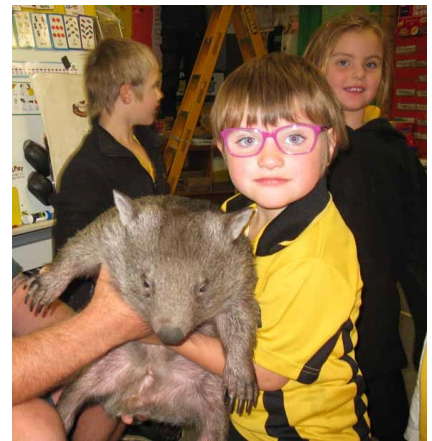
# K-6 News

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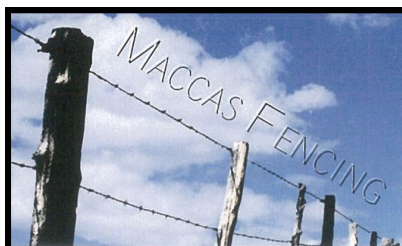

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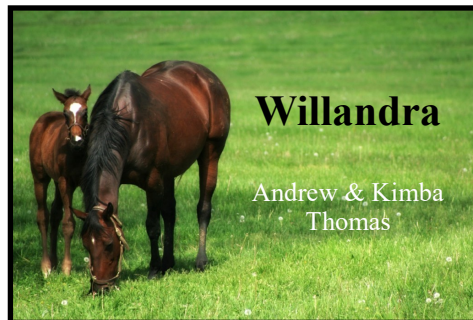
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
