Principal News with Mr Hughes



Dear Parents/Caregivers

As I reflect on the changes that have occurred this term due to the COVID-19 pandemic I am amazed at the resilience displayed by our students and the way in which they are able to continue to engage with their learning so effectively. A large part of this is

because of the support our students receive at home and the support they receive at school from our fantastic staff. The importance of maintaining consistent, positive and supportive routines is paramount for our students at this time.

In regards to sporting events for the remainder of the year all PSSA and CHS activities are cancelled and will not be rescheduled. This includes any knockout and statewide competitions. The health and wellbeing of everyone involved is paramount and at the heart of this decision.

Education Week is in Term 3 of next term from the 3rd until the 7th of August. The theme is "Working Together." At this stage we are unsure of what our celebrations at Coolah Central School will look like until we know what restrictions are in place closer to the event.

A reminder that parents at this stage are still not to enter school grounds unless for a specific meeting with approval from the Principal. Parents and

caregivers are also requested to avoid congregating in groups during drop off and pick up times. Parents should remain outside of the school gates on the footpath and continue to socially distance. You may like to nominate a space with your children a small distance from the main school gate to meet after school to enable this to occur effectively. The school Executive Team have discussed the revised procedures for semester 1 reporting in line with departmental guideline. Teachers will finish writing reports at the end of term with reports being provided to parents in Week 2 of Term 3. Reports will not feature A-E grades but will instead include learning habits and a teacher comment based on evidence of work produced by students both at home and at school. Year 11 reports will be as normal.

- Aim for 2 serves a day.

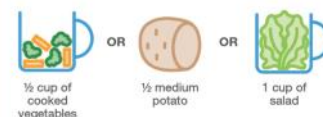

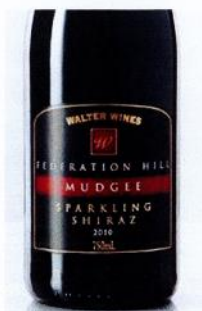
